### **FROM THE RECTOR**

## Debunking the Resurrection – a tedious Easter tradition

IT HAS BECOME an unhallowed Easter tradition for publicity hungry clerics to clamber into the pulpit and denounce the resurrection as "bunk." Indeed, denials of the resurrection by trendy clerics are so frequent these days they scarcely rate a mention in the media.

One of the disturbing things about all this is how little outcry there is from the people in the pews of the mainline churches about the weird goings-on in the upper echelons of their denominations and jurisdictions — goings-on that are by no means confined to doubts about the resurrection.

To be sure, a few congregations have upped-stakes and

moved on, while less motivated individuals have given up on church for the golf course.

But in most denominations a majority of the faithful appear to have opted to stay put and ignore the cacophony. It is not so much that most of them subscribe to the skepticism as are confused by it

Indeed, many feel ill equipped to defend orthodoxy. After all, the folks attacking it usually can brandish impressive looking sheepskins from once distinguished seminaries and universities.

Those sheepskins, however, are often simply a cover for wolves in sheep's clothing. A master's of divinity degree does not necessarily a scriptural theologian make.

Indeed, there is good reason to suspect that only a very flimsy grasp of Holy Scripture is expected of many – perhaps the majority – of today's theology students.

That, at least, is one conclusion from the course offerings one encounters at many universities and mainline theological colleges. "Ecological Theology," "Patriarchic Hegemony in the Old Testament" and "Gender Issues in the New Testament" do not appear to demand scriptural knowledge in any great depth and breadth. Rather the contrary.

Blame for this state of affairs lies not with the unfortunate graduates of such institutions, many, if not most, of whom arrived at their chosen schools bright-eyed, bushy tailed and full of enthusiasm for the faith.

The culprits are the intellectually lazy academics who lead spiritually underdeveloped minds astray by deliberately undermining trust in witness of the Evangelists and Apostles. Yet they, in turn, are merely the dupes of the real trailblazers.

Today the names of the authors of modern skepticism have largely faded from public memory. Who, for instance, remembers the long-retired Episcopal bishop John Shelby who thumbed his nose at the basic precepts of the faith he professed to espouse in books that were lauded as sophisticated scriptural scholarship?

Who remembers the Jesus Seminar – the group of 74 "scholars" who met regularly to vote on which parts of the New Testament they considered genuine (less than 18 percent they've decided)?

The problem with theirs brand of scholarship is not just that it is intellectually dishonest, derivative and predictable. Its exponents talents lie not so much in learning as garnering publicity and media hype.

It's worth asking how much media attention would be generated by books with such titles as Theologians Believe The

Bible Is True or Bishop Believes In God? Not much I'd warrant. But, when all's said and done, the real issue is not what these folks think about God but, rather, what God thinks about them. And that's a horse of a wholly different color. **GPH**\*
