#### John F. Nicoll Pipe Band

#### Races

#### Joseph Richey Hospice



The Joseph Richey Hospice, established in 1987, is Maryland's oldest free-standing hospice. Richey House, a 20-bed inpatient and residential hospice facility, is located in downtown Baltimore. The hospice also provides home hospice care to the greater Baltimore community. Joseph Richey was founded by the All Saints Sisters of the Poor and by Mount Calvary Episcopal

Church to offer care to those who could not otherwise access hospice care because they were alone or lacked an able caregiver in the home. The hospice is state licensed, and Medicare/ Medicaid certified.

#### Dr Bob's Place

This \$4.5 million dollar facility is the first hospice for children on the East Coast of the United States. Dr Bob's Place will be located at 838 North Eutaw Street near Joseph Richey House in downtown Baltimore. Dr Bob's provides 10 private rooms, as well as beautiful public rooms and play areas. The 20,800 square foot facility offers full hospice services to children, as well as providing hospice services to children at home.
