STATE OF THE CHURCH: PART III

Rector's Report 2012/13

FOR St. Stephen's, the year 2012/13 was marked by a number of notable arrivals and departures. Not least **Anne Hawkins**, our beloved Director of Pastoral Care, resigned after 15 years devoted service. She has been succeeded as director by **Happy Riley**, who like Annie, brings to the task both nursing expertise and boundless energy.

Stephanie Verhage, the long serving head of the Parish Life Committee, handed over the baton to joint chairmen **Priscilla** and **Dick Huffman**. And **Donna Szper** tendered her resignation after an exhausting decade as organizer of both the Cookie Walk and the Garden Party.

Donna will continue to serve with **Rosa Halbert** as delegate to our diocesan synod, where the pair have earned the sobriquet "**Trouble One and Trouble Two**."

My near departure with a heart attack last year prompted the arrival of **The Rev. Michael Kerouac** to help **Fr. Rhae Kelley** run the parish in my absence. In the short time Fr. Kerouac has been with us, he and his wife Carolyn have become such firm favorites that we asked him to join us as Vicar.

Hard on the heels of Fr. Kerouac's appointment, parishioner **Wiley Hawks** was set apart as Sub-Deacon. Wiley has been assisting at the altar and helping the St. Stephen's pastoral care team in its work both in the parish and the wider community.

We provide chaplains for organizations including the U.S. Navy League, the Ancient & Honorable Mechanical Company of Baltimore and the St. George's Society. We also provide pastoral care and support at The Joseph Richey Hospice, Union Memorial Hospital and The Greater Baltimore Medical Center.

The clergy conduct regular church services at retirement communities and nursing homes, including Glen Meadows, Mays Chapel Ridge, Genesis at Brightwood, Genesis at Mays Chapel, Lorien at Mays Chapel, Lorien in Columbia and Roland Park Place, as well as occasional services at other communities including Heart Homes, Blakehurst, Edenwald and Keswick.

The parish continues its monthly collections of non-perishable foodstuffs and household goods for **At Jacob's Well**, a charity that helps Baltimore's mentally ill homeless population.

The Joseph Richey Hospice and its new hospice for children, **Dr. Bob's Place**, is a particular focus of our community service. Parishioner **Bea Kallina**, the hospice's Volunteer Coordinator, reports an increasing need for our volunteer services particularly at the new children's hospice.

Our Tuesday, Friday morning and Wednesday afternoon **Bible Studies** are led by **Brock Johnson** who also serves as lay reader and Sunday School teacher.

The **Knitting Circle** – mentored by **Happy Riley** and **Karen Ruthig** – meets in the parish hall on Thursdays at 10 AM to produce beautifully crafted comforts for the patients at the Joseph Richey Hospice, local nursing homes and folks on the parish sick list. New members are always welcome,

The newsletter now has a new editor – **Don Ruthig** – and comes to you courtesy of the hard-working mailroom team: **Donna Szper, Joyce Perlberg (and Misty), Mar Bopst** and **Jim Halbert.** (If you change your address or if you're going away for few days, please let them know so they can make the necessary adjustments to the mailing list.) The annual **Cookie Walk**, organized by redoubtable **Donna Szper** was as successful as ever. Pricilla and Dick Huffman organized this year's no less successful British Garden Party. (A full report on which will appear in next week's newsletter.)

The Parish Life Committee organized a host of other events, including a diet-busting Shrove Tuesday Pancake & Sausage Supper. The committee's Silly Summer Suppers ran through the summer and into the fall, attracting an enthusiastic following not only among parishioners, but among folks in the neighborhood.

The parish owes a considerable debt of gratitude to the Vestry for its work in overseeing the parish's affairs. They are **John Cobb**, Rector's Warden; **Gordon Turner & Don Ruthig**, People's Warden; **Gordon Turner**, People's Warden Emeritus, and **Paul**

Douglas, warden's assistant; **Bill Hawkins**, treasurer; **Dr. Kirby von Kessler**, registrar; **Alan Gushue**, fund-raiser-in-chief; **Brock Johnson**, director of Adult Education; **Donna Szper** who represents the parish life committee, **J. Brice Richardson**, who is a member of the diocesan Standing Committee, and **Sev Miller**.

At this year's annual meeting, we shall be filling three vestry postions. The nominees are: **Donna Szper, John Cobb and Gordon Turner**, all retiring vestrymen.

The building and grounds have never looked better thanks to Grounds Chairman Martha Miller, Buildings Chairman Don Ruthig and Brock Johnson (a.k.a. "Sparkles"), who lead a team of enthusiastic volunteers, including Colby Hawks, Judy Elliot, Sev Miller and Bill Hawkins.

Thanks to the creativity of Adric our Organist & Choir Master, the Choir of Men & Boys has maintained a remarkably high standard despite an acute shortage of trebles.

We are always on the lookout for trebles, experienced singers, as well as probationers and learners. If you know a boy who would enjoy singing and who would appreciate a splendid musical education – all for free – please let us know his name. We'd love to recruit him.

Adric and the choir have maintained their splendid Choral Evensong program.. These services are generally sung on the first Sunday of the month and the offertory is in aid of the choir's special charity, **Dr. Bob's Place.**

The choir sings only Evensong on the first Sunday of the month and both Choral Eucharist and Mattins on subsequent Sundays. The officiant at Mattins and Evensong is usually **Peter Threadgill**, our head lay reader and resident composer.

Thanks also goes to **Lloyd Bowers**, formerly organist at St. Luke's Episcopal Church, Carey Street, Baltimore, who, from time to time, serves as assistant organist.

Our lay readers are Gordon Turner, Paul Douglas, Dan Bursi, J. Brice Richardson, Bob Reynolds, Dr. Kirby von Kessler and Chris Carroll Browne.

Postulants John Novicki and Michael Belt will, God willing, be ordered Deacons by Bishop Vaughan Sunday, June 9th. Both have been busy with studies and with outreach programs. John acts as lay chaplain to a group of re-enactors. Mike, assisted by Wiley Hawks, provides pastoral care at a local nursing home

The Sunday School gained what we hope will prove to be a valuable recruitment tool in the form of a magnificent new children's playground. It was paid for thanks to the efforts of a team of parents and friends and a profitable second hand clothes sale.

Our thanks goes particularly to Sunday School teachers Diane Novicki, Tracey Gushue, Tracey Collins, Allison Hendricks, Alison Belt and Brock Johnson. Diane also leads the Junior Altar Guild.

Our talented **Flower Guild** continues to deck the sanctuary with spectacular floral arrangements. It was hard to imagine the church appearing more beautiful than it did at Christmastide until we saw the Easter flowers. Almost last, but very far from least, our long suffering treasurer **Bill Hawkins** would like to remind you that finances always get tight as summer approaches.
